Sleep Information

With some major exceptions, sleep is a lot like sex. It's something you really look forward to, and it makes you feel great when you're done. Most important, though, sleep is more like your boss -- it's much more agreeable when it goes uninterrupted.

Lack of sleep makes you less mentally aware and more fatigued, causes you to eat more, and places you at a higher risk for accidents. Plus, being fatigued puts you at greater risk of making choices that age you (when you're tired, it's easier to order the bacon-double-fat burgers than the grilled salmon).

1. **Get on a schedule.** Your body clock runs best when you're on a regular sleep schedule, like a baby. Aim to get up at the same time every day -- whether you have a full day of work or a full day of cartoons. On the weekends, try to rise within one hour of the time you get up during the week.

2. **Change your temperature.** The ideal setting for sleep is a cool, dark room. If you're having trouble sleeping, try removing a layer of clothing (like socks) or lowering the thermostat.

3. **At night, eat foods that contain melatonin** -- a substance that helps regulate the body clock. That means oats, sweet corn, or rice. Or try a complex carbohydrate that has serotonin, like vegetables or whole-grain pasta. You can also go with the classic remedy: skim milk. Of course, you know to avoid stimulants like caffeine and exercise near bedtime. And try to avoid eating within 3 hours of going to bed.

A Mukwonago, Wis., man is in trouble for allegedly

Michael F. Knurr, 39, was charged with five counts
of fourth-degree sexual assault for incidents in

year, the Milwaukee Journal Sentinel reported. The
criminal complaint filed Tuesday details one

Bank Robber Foiled Twice in Three Days

NEW YORK - New York police say a bumbling bandit
attempted to rob the same bank twice in the three-day
period and ended up sprayed with dye on both
occasions. Police allege that Clenzo Thompson, who
had been arrested three years earlier after he dropped
his state ID at the site of a bank robbery, was given a
stack of bills containing \$2,340 and a dye pack by a
teller at Commerce Bank's Park Slope branch, the New
York Post reported Monday. Despite the explosion of
the dye pack, Thompson allegedly returned to the bank
two days later and retrieved \$1,740 and another dye
pack from a different teller. This one exploded inside
a taxi cab, causing the driver to flee. The vehicle was
abandoned a few blocks away. Police said they located
the alleged thief at a friend's house in Boonton, N.J.,
after recovering fingerprints from the bank.

Signs of Nude Jogger Shrink in Cold Weather

SAN JOSE, Calif. - California's recent cold snap has
ended sightings of a middle-age man who likes to jog
naked in a park outside San Jose. While rangers at the
Fremont Older Open Space Preserve have never
encountered the man, numerous park visitors have
reported seeing the same man running in the buff for
the past year and a half, the San Jose Mercury News
said Thursday. The man wears only glasses, shoes and
a black tam hat unless it's a hot day, said Sue Bowdoin,
who has been startled by him twice while riding her
horse through the 739-acre park. "He passed me and
said 'Good evening'", Bowdoin said. "I think he has
a screw loose." Others who have crossed paths with the
man told the newspaper he is cordial and polite and
doesn't do anything threatening. However, nude
jogging is not only illegal in the park, but dangerous
because of the abundance of poison oak, the report
said.

Man Flips Off Sheriff, Crashes Car

CHARLESTON, W.Va. A West Virginia motorist
flipped the bird to the Kanawha County sheriff, promptly
drove into a guardrail and was arrested for drunken
driving. Glenn Harold Vickers, 53, of South Charleston,
W. Va., was arrested Thursday night
a short way from the scene of the crash, the
Charleston (W.Va.) Daily Mail reported Friday. Sheriff
Mike Rutherford was driving home from a County
Commission meeting when Vickers' station wagon began
weaving into his lane, the newspaper said. The suspect
tailgated Rutherford's unmarked black Jeep and crowded
his bumper three times, the sheriff told the newspaper. "I
thought he was going to ram me," the sheriff said this
morning. "He'd come right on my bumper, then he would
just back off." When the two vehicles approached
an interstate exit, Vickers extended his middle finger in
the sheriff's direction and crashed into the guardrail.
"There's no question in my mind he was not paying
attention," Rutherford said. "When he was stopped and I
introduced myself, you could tell he was surprised. It was
like all the air was taken out of him."

Lawyer Picks up DUI Client, Gets DUI Also

MADISON, Wis. An attorney went to the Madison, Wis.,
police station to pick up a client arrested for drunken
driving and wound up arrested on the same charge. "I did
not think I was intoxicated and I was wrong," attorney
Rick Petri, 64, told The Wisconsin State Journal. Petri
said he had been out Wednesday night then went home to
watch a basketball game on TV and had a couple of
drinks before going to bed. Around 2 a.m. Thursday, he
got a call from police saying his client had been arrested
and asking whether he would pick him up. Figuring all
the alcohol was out of his system by then, Petri said, "I
thought I'd give it a shot." But upon arriving at the police
station, he was given a field sobriety test and blew a 0.09
percent on a breath test -- above the Wisconsin limit of
0.08 percent. Petri and his client were both cited for
first offense DUIs, which carry penalties of fines,
possible license suspensions and alcohol assessment, the
newspaper said. "If there's anybody who should have
known better, it was me," he told the State Journal. "All I
can do is apologize to my client, my family and my
community." **Page 11**

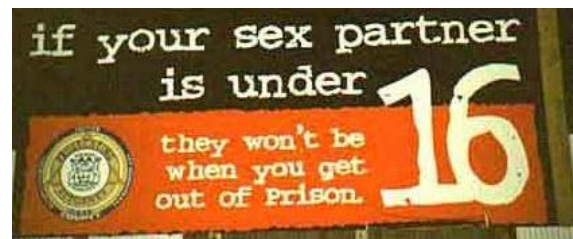
Air Date: May 3 2-hour Addison spin off

Infidelity Punishable by Prison?

An obscure provision in Michigan's criminal law could ultimately cause spouses who are unfaithful in their marriages to receive life sentences in prison.

The Detroit Free Press reported Michigan's Court of Appeals found last November that, given the right circumstances, an unfaithful married individual could be hit with the state's most serious sexual assault charge.

The court's decision was based on a provision that states if the adultery is committed in conjunction with another felony, then the sexual indiscretion could be seen as first-degree criminal sexual conduct.

The court ruling placed Michigan Attorney General Mike Cox, who confessed to an adulterous relationship in 2005, in the limelight as it was an appeal his office was handling that sparked the court's decision.

Yet a spokesman for Cox promptly explained that such a legal move was ludicrous in a state that hasn't convicted anyone for felony infidelity since 1971. "To even ask about this borders on the nutty," Rusty Hills said to the paper. "Nobody connects the attorney general with this -- N-O-B-O-D-Y -- and anybody who thinks otherwise is hallucinogenic."

Donald Hayes said that his wheelchair is a motorized vehicle and that forcing him to cross a busy street to get coffee at another Dunkin' Donuts would be even less safe, the Boston Herald reported. "It's discrimination," Hayes said. "I'm just defending my rights. I'm not looking for monetary compensation." A spokesman for the chain said that individual franchisees decide on safety policies for their stores. Weymouth Police Chief James Thomas told the Quincy (Mass.) Patriot Ledger that he agrees with the franchisee about a potential safety problem.

Job vacancies at the bottom of the world

The Australian government's Antarctic Division is finding it hard to recruit people to work on the frozen continent. I can think of few words I'd like to nominate here, but I'm sure someone would complain. Ha. Ha.

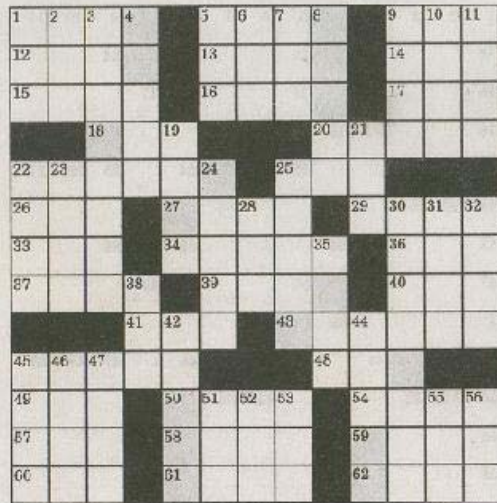
Curvy females attract more men

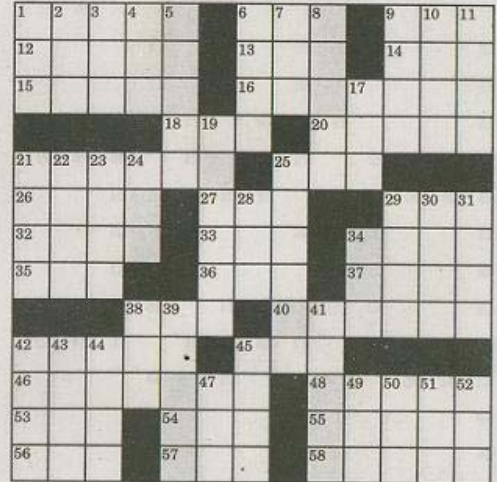

Letter From Cousin Carol to All PCTBP Donors

My dear Friend(s) –

April 1, 2007

Here I am! You were wondering, weren't you? God, it's been a hell of a ride this winter! I'm, like, way too old and way too cool for a roller coaster such as Ohio has been these past three months. Breathe. I saw a robin red-breast today, a caterpillar, and the sun. God, if this isn't Spring, please just let me pretend. Please.

On a more floral note, we've been very busy planting seeds to grow the Projects. Since I have been in Ohio, I have had many appointments, meetings, and conversations with local, state, and federal politicians, judges, attorneys, churches, corporations and other authorities. I have met with many executive directors of other non-profit organizations to design collaborative efforts where we can work together to provide re-entry programs, programs for families, programs for children, programs for communities. We are brainstorming the types of support, education, vocational training, etc. that ex-offenders and their families need in order to reduce recidivism; To break life cycles and help to keep families together. We are looking at what entire communities need to not only heal..... but to THRIVE. We have traveled to Pittsburgh, Cleveland, and Columbus in search of program funding and true participants. Participants that are interested in programs that continue in time, not temporary fixes. Roy has traveled to Austin and dined with Governor Perry, and spoken to Stop Prison Rape, in Los Angeles. We have met with several universities and colleges. We have been asked to come to Detroit to talk about re-entry housing options. And, since we have expanded into Ohio, and the differences in laws governing non-profit organizations varies from state to state, the due diligence around those differences for each phase and location of our projects has required many consultations with attorneys and other professionals. More tweaking of business plans and budgets. More coffee.

We have begun being more proactive with our pursuit of funding. We have been coached by a grant specialist to be aggressive in seeking support from foundations across America. We are working closely with him instead of chasing grant writers who are already over-burdened with projects. That means we have people sitting in libraries in Amarillo, Canton, and Youngstown researching foundations of which the Prison Coffee Table Book Project fits their criteria for funding. That is our primary focus for funding. We are also seeking funds for Pen Friends & Services, Inc.'s operations budget, which includes The Son of Trash newsletter. We expect that the Mushfake Store and the National Prison Art Museum will come together on its own just from the exposure they are getting as a unified effort here.

We will soon learn if our grant to do art with the children of incarcerated parents will be funded. The purpose of the project is to bring these children together on Friday and Saturday for 8 weeks this summer and do art therapy, resulting in an art show that would be attended by the chief politicians of the state. The art would then travel to other cities for a month at a time. The funding of this grant will bring us press and recognition for the projects. It will unify children of the prison genre and visually project the impact of incarceration on families. A gateway.

We are seeking to acquire a building of 8,000 square feet that could be donated to us for a performing arts center. We need a center for a safe zone to accommodate a lot of our projects, activities and offices. If we could house the store and museum in the same building, it would be marvelous. Maybe two buildings adjoining one another. An old school or church. It will come to us and be perfect..... and as a donation. Watch.

We have solved the riddle of how to best distribute the PCTBP across the world without giving away 65% of the retail price to a distribution company. We'll announce that as soon as the contract is signed. We were given that answer when we spent 5 hours at Manchester-Bidwell Inc. in Pittsburgh last week. Yeh! Now we just have to get the funding for 20,000 initial copies and we are ready to rock and roll, Volume I and II. Thank you for your patience as we have journeyed down this obstacle course called the learning curve of publishing a book of such magnitude. We are getting close enough to smell the press ink. Yes!

Each of the pages in Volume I of the PCTBP has to be (manually) re-scanned or photographed, and then be superimposed onto an electronic graphic design, and stored on a computer disk before it can be sent to press. We have finally concluded which high-resolution scanner we have to obtain for the job. Since it is a \$500 item, we are proposing a donation from a large corporation. We actually met the photographer-of-choice at the Akron Zoo. He was photographing the tigers for the zoo. He owns a graphic corporation and is a noted photographer who supports our project. So, one at a time, the pieces come to us. Presents from God. Not as fast as we want, but then, after all, we're not really the ones in charge of the process. We're just the visionaries and worker bees.
